Single restaurant server	\$22,567 median local wage; tips assumed at 45% of earnings; no children	\$52
Teacher and office clerk family	\$61,888 and \$31,338 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$597
Single nurse with overtime	\$73,135 median local wage; overtime pay assumed at 5% of earnings; no children	\$1,230
Single-parent home health aide	\$27,899 median local wage; 1 child	Tax increase of \$136
Electrician family	One earner at \$53,966 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$497
Plumber family	One earner at \$55,428 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$560
Construction worker family	One earner at \$37,371 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$351
