Retired federal worker couple	Social Security based on national average annual benefits (\$24,852 and \$11,808); pension modeled as \$25,000 and \$20,000 in taxable retirement income	\$1,518
Single restaurant server	\$37,578 median local wage; tips assumed at 45% of earnings; no children	\$420
Teacher and office clerk family	\$82,190 and \$48,092 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$790
Single nurse with overtime	\$105,722 median local wage; overtime pay assumed at 5% of earnings; no children	\$1,520
Single-parent home health aide	\$39,507 median local wage; 1 child	\$306
Electrician family	One earner at \$79,257 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$505
Plumber family	One earner at \$73,014 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$341
Construction worker family	One earner at \$53,860 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$341
Police officer family	One earner at \$85,760 median local wage; married couple with 2 children	\$705

Firefighter family	One earner at \$80,315 median local wage; married couple with 2 children	\$705
Truck driver and home health aide family	\$60,652 and \$39,507 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$705
