Retired federal worker couple	Social Security based on national average annual benefits (\$24,852 and \$11,808); pension modeled as \$25,000 and \$20,000 in taxable retirement income	\$1,798
Single restaurant server	\$20,631 median local wage; tips assumed at 45% of earnings; no children	\$46
Teacher and office clerk family	\$67,998 and \$40,603 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$828
Single nurse with overtime	\$89,113 median local wage; overtime pay assumed at 5% of earnings; no children	\$1,283
Single-parent home health aide	\$28,774 median local wage; 1 child	\$256
Electrician family	One earner at \$60,596 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$621
Plumber family	One earner at \$57,950 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$621
Construction worker family	One earner at \$39,090 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$363
Police officer family	One earner at \$58,012 median local wage; married couple with 2 children	\$821

Firefighter family	One earner at \$47,326 median local wage; married couple with 2 children	\$821
Truck driver and home health aide family	\$58,239 and \$28,774 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$643
