Retired federal worker couple	Social Security based on national average annual benefits (\$24,852 and \$11,808); pension modeled as \$25,000 and \$20,000 in taxable retirement income	\$1,798
Single restaurant server	\$18,397 median local wage; tips assumed at 45% of earnings; no children	\$46
Teacher and office clerk family	\$66,253 and \$37,882 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$828
Single nurse with overtime	\$83,864 median local wage; overtime pay assumed at 5% of earnings; no children	\$1,225
Single-parent home health aide	\$25,139 median local wage; 1 child	\$56
Electrician family	One earner at \$54,566 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$621
Plumber family	One earner at \$52,095 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$621
Construction worker family	One earner at \$37,968 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$363
Police officer family	One earner at \$48,444 median local wage; married couple with 2 children	\$821

Firefighter family	One earner at \$44,732 median local wage; married couple with 2 children	\$821
Truck driver and home health aide family	\$54,175 and \$25,139 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$643
