Single restaurant server	\$29,845 median local wage; tips assumed at 45% of earnings; no children	Tax increase of \$30
Teacher and office clerk family	\$59,280 and \$42,209 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$764
Single nurse with overtime	\$87,281 median local wage; overtime pay assumed at 5% of earnings; no children	\$1,427
Single-parent home health aide	\$31,925 median local wage; 1 child	\$407
Electrician family	One earner at \$57,436 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$564
Plumber family	One earner at \$57,188 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$564
Construction worker family	One earner at \$45,545 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$564
