Single restaurant server	\$28,720 median local wage; tips assumed at 45% of earnings; no children	Tax increase of \$63
Teacher and office clerk family	\$54,839 and \$41,702 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$764
Single nurse with overtime	\$85,659 median local wage; overtime pay assumed at 5% of earnings; no children	\$1,409
Single-parent home health aide	\$29,802 median local wage; 1 child	\$407
Electrician family	One earner at \$57,078 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$564
Plumber family	One earner at \$52,248 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$564
Construction worker family	One earner at \$40,063 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$564
