Retired federal worker couple	Social Security based on national average annual benefits (\$24,852 and \$11,808); pension modeled as \$25,000 and \$20,000 in taxable retirement income	\$1,742
Single restaurant server	\$28,573 median local wage; tips assumed at 45% of earnings; no children	Tax increase of \$62
Teacher and office clerk family	\$57,976 and \$41,394 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$764
Single nurse with overtime	\$86,798 median local wage; overtime pay assumed at 5% of earnings; no children	\$1,422
Single-parent home health aide	\$31,473 median local wage; 1 child	\$407
Electrician family	One earner at \$56,532 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$564
Plumber family	One earner at \$55,743 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$564
Construction worker family	One earner at \$45,337 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$564
Police officer family		\$764

Methodology: Average tax changes are modeled using Tax-Calculator. Illustrative household examples are modeled in PolicyEngine using geography-specific wage inputs where available and do not reflect geography-wide averages.
