Retired federal worker couple	Social Security based on national average annual benefits (\$24,852 and \$11,808); pension modeled as \$25,000 and \$20,000 in taxable retirement income	\$1,474
Single restaurant server	\$38,380 median local wage; tips assumed at 45% of earnings; no children	\$517
Teacher and office clerk family	\$87,967 and \$50,914 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$1,052
Single nurse with overtime	\$101,874 median local wage; overtime pay assumed at 5% of earnings; no children	\$1,905
Single-parent home health aide	\$40,586 median local wage; 1 child	\$200
Electrician family	One earner at \$80,873 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$485
Plumber family	One earner at \$82,209 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$485
Construction worker family	One earner at \$61,213 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$565
Police officer family	One earner at \$80,285 median local wage; married couple with 2 children	\$685

Firefighter family	One earner at \$72,566 median local wage; married couple with 2 children	\$687
Truck driver and home health aide family	\$62,349 and \$40,586 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$685
