Retired federal worker couple	Social Security based on national average annual benefits (\$24,852 and \$11,808); pension modeled as \$25,000 and \$20,000 in taxable retirement income	\$1,526
Single restaurant server	\$19,077 median local wage; tips assumed at 45% of earnings; no children	\$37
Teacher and office clerk family	\$61,883 and \$38,071 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$1,761
Single nurse with overtime	\$82,257 median local wage; overtime pay assumed at 5% of earnings; no children	\$1,637
Single-parent home health aide	\$29,886 median local wage; 1 child	\$272
Electrician family	One earner at \$59,978 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$504
Plumber family	One earner at \$56,458 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$504
Construction worker family	One earner at \$42,528 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$348
Police officer family	One earner at \$59,731 median local wage; married couple with 2 children	\$704

Firefighter family	One earner at \$47,316 median local wage; married couple with 2 children	\$548
Truck driver and home health aide family	\$53,338 and \$29,886 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$590

Methodology: Average tax changes are modeled using Tax-Calculator. Illustrative household examples are modeled in PolicyEngine using geography-specific wage inputs where available and do not reflect geography-wide averages.
