Retired federal worker couple	Social Security based on national average annual benefits (\$24,852 and \$11,808); pension modeled as \$25,000 and \$20,000 in taxable retirement income	\$1,485
Single restaurant server	\$25,511 median local wage; tips assumed at 45% of earnings; no children	\$91
Teacher and office clerk family	\$61,253 and \$37,927 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$1,404
Single nurse with overtime	\$81,588 median local wage; overtime pay assumed at 5% of earnings; no children	\$1,118
Single-parent home health aide	\$30,730 median local wage; 1 child	\$291
Electrician family	One earner at \$59,474 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$566
Plumber family	One earner at \$59,000 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$566
Construction worker family	One earner at \$44,742 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$307
Police officer family	One earner at \$74,906 median local wage; married couple with 2 children	\$766

Firefighter family	One earner at \$65,527 median local wage; married couple with 2 children	\$766
Truck driver and home health aide family	\$61,842 and \$30,730 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$1,404
