Single restaurant server	\$29,433 median local wage; tips assumed at 45% of earnings; no children	Tax increase of \$29
Teacher and office clerk family	\$65,891 and \$43,023 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$800
Single nurse with overtime	\$101,652 median local wage; overtime pay assumed at 5% of earnings; no children	\$1,602
Single-parent home health aide	\$26,798 median local wage; 1 child	Tax increase of \$227
Electrician family	One earner at \$59,464 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$346
Plumber family	One earner at \$62,151 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$346
Construction worker family	One earner at \$40,161 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$346
