Retired federal worker couple	Social Security based on national average annual benefits (\$24,852 and \$11,808); pension modeled as \$25,000 and \$20,000 in taxable retirement income	\$1,524
Single restaurant server	\$30,508 median local wage; tips assumed at 45% of earnings; no children	\$31
Teacher and office clerk family	\$62,375 and \$43,114 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$800
Single nurse with overtime	\$97,713 median local wage; overtime pay assumed at 5% of earnings; no children	\$1,558
Single-parent home health aide	\$28,167 median local wage; 1 child	\$34
Electrician family	One earner at \$59,981 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$346
Plumber family	One earner at \$63,510 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$346
Construction worker family	One earner at \$40,312 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$346
Police officer family	One earner at \$85,470 median local wage; married couple with 2 children	\$800

Firefighter family	One earner at \$61,126 median local wage; married couple with 2 children	\$546
Truck driver and home health aide family	\$57,225 and \$28,167 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$800
