Retired federal worker couple	Social Security based on national average annual benefits (\$24,852 and \$11,808); pension modeled as \$25,000 and \$20,000 in taxable retirement income	\$1,524
Single restaurant server	\$30,332 median local wage; tips assumed at 45% of earnings; no children	\$21
Teacher and office clerk family	\$62,259 and \$41,888 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$800
Single nurse with overtime	\$93,778 median local wage; overtime pay assumed at 5% of earnings; no children	\$1,515
Single-parent home health aide	\$26,703 median local wage; 1 child	Tax increase of \$224
Electrician family	One earner at \$58,027 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$346
Plumber family	One earner at \$62,861 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$346
Construction worker family	One earner at \$39,948 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$346
Police officer family		\$800

Methodology: Average tax changes are modeled using Tax-Calculator. Illustrative household examples are modeled in PolicyEngine using geography-specific wage inputs where available and do not reflect geography-wide averages.
