Retired federal worker couple	Social Security based on national average annual benefits (\$24,852 and \$11,808); pension modeled as \$25,000 and \$20,000 in taxable retirement income	\$1,686
Single restaurant server	\$62,707 median local wage; tips assumed at 45% of earnings; no children	\$1,836
Teacher and office clerk family	\$64,117 and \$48,530 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$708
Single nurse with overtime	\$87,662 median local wage; overtime pay assumed at 5% of earnings; no children	\$1,125
Single-parent home health aide	\$35,271 median local wage; 1 child	\$300
Electrician family	One earner at \$61,430 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$508
Plumber family	One earner at \$62,336 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$508
Construction worker family	One earner at \$48,077 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$508
Police officer family	One earner at \$65,569 median local wage; married couple with 2 children	\$708

Firefighter family	One earner at \$47,491 median local wage; married couple with 2 children	\$708
Truck driver and home health aide family	\$58,022 and \$35,271 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$708
