Single restaurant server	\$31,214 median local wage; tips assumed at 45% of earnings; no children	Tax increase of \$21
Teacher and office clerk family	\$56,040 and \$35,157 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$631
Single nurse with overtime	\$82,349 median local wage; overtime pay assumed at 5% of earnings; no children	\$1,244
Single-parent home health aide	\$27,343 median local wage; 1 child	Tax increase of \$369
Electrician family	One earner at \$65,733 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$431
Plumber family	One earner at \$51,094 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$455
Construction worker family	One earner at \$39,914 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$455
