Retired federal worker couple	Social Security based on national average annual benefits (\$24,852 and \$11,808); pension modeled as \$25,000 and \$20,000 in taxable retirement income	\$4,159
Single restaurant server	\$21,469 median local wage; tips assumed at 45% of earnings; no children	\$268
Teacher and office clerk family	\$80,107 and \$44,464 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$6,256
Single nurse with overtime	\$102,038 median local wage; overtime pay assumed at 5% of earnings; no children	\$5,574
Single-parent home health aide	\$30,433 median local wage; 1 child	\$2,260
Electrician family	One earner at \$63,971 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$4,339
Plumber family	One earner at \$62,141 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$4,289
Construction worker family	One earner at \$41,905 median local wage; married couple with 1 child	\$2,673
Police officer family	One earner at \$64,555 median local wage; married couple with 2 children	\$5,296

Firefighter family	One earner at \$50,644 median local wage; married couple with 2 children	\$4,638
Truck driver and home health aide family	\$62,348 and \$30,433 median local wages; married couple with 2 children	\$6,048
